Dr. Calvo Buezas is a professor of Social Anthropology in the Departments of Political Science and Sociology at Complutense University in Madrid, Spain. He is the author of hundreds of articles and multiple books, among these, are: *Inmigracion y Universidad: Prejuicios racistas y vaores solidarios* (2001); *Inmigracion y Racismo: Asi sienten los jovenes del siglo XXI* (2000).

Dr. Calvo Buezas is Director and Founder of the Center for the Studies of Migration and Racism (CEMIRA) at the Computense University. He has taught courses and directed research in both the US (California and New York) and Latin America (Mexico, Colombia and Venezuela) and is the recipient of several distinguished national awards, among these: *El Premio National de Investigacion sobre Bienestar Social; El Premio Hidalgo con Gunter Grass; La Placa de Honor de la Lucha contra el Racismo y la Xenofobia; y, La Medalla de la Concordia de Puerto Rico el Premio Cultura 2000.*

Embracing a cultural blend

Conference delves into concept of bilingual, multicultural U.S.

Mestizaje — a blend of cultures and heritage — is a word that was on the lips of the Spanish diplomats, scholars and local experts who attended a three-day conference this week in Santa Fe sponsored by the Paris-based Unión Latina.

José Luis Dicenta, a former ambassador from Spain and now secretary general of the international group, predicted, "The U.S. is going to become a *mestizaje*, and that's a plus, not a minus."

He was speaking Wednesday morning before the free public seminar, titled "Migration: A Creative Force in Communities" and co-sponsored by the city of Santa Fe as part of its 400th anniversary celebration.

"Migration is the problem of the 21st century, not just in the U.S., but across the world," Dicenta said.

With an estimated 45 million Spanish speakers living in the U.S., the country "is sitting on a gold bar. Becoming a full-blown bilingual country will only capitalize the

United States," he added.

Tomás Calvo Buezas, an anthropology professor and founding president of the Center for Migration and Racism Studies in Madrid, said the human being has been a migrant since the beginning of time, and "the interchange of territory has been eternal."

When it comes to moving forward as a country and as a state, children are the future, he stressed.

"Hispanic children, immigrant children, should speak better English than anyone in the world. But they should also learn Spanish," Calvo Buezas said.

Among Unión Latina's missions is the conservation of language.

María Estela de Ríos, founder of Orion International Technologies, an engineering company in Albuquerque that works with the U.S. Defense Department, agrees with Calvo Buezas.

She is the daughter of Mexican immigrants who grew up in East Los Angeles, always feeling proud of her Mexican heritage, language and culture.

"When you belong to a place, when you

are respected ... you embrace the place you are at and you want to give back," said Ríos. She added that her own children have college degrees and have served in the military.

"No one can say I am not American," she said.

Being bilingual, she said, has helped seal business deals and has helped expand her company's services. Ríos also founded the Fundación Educativa Mexicana de Nuevo México, a nonprofit educational organization five years ago.

Fred Mondragón, secretary for the New Mexico Economic Development Department, said New Mexico is interested in building ties with Spain to bring Spanish business to the state.

Embracing economic opportunities along with culture and heritage is an idea both Mayor David Coss and Councilor Rebecca Wurzburger champion.

"It's important to try to open the doors and let people know we are here," Wurzburger said.

Santa Fe can thank an important international organization for yet another opportunity to celebrate our 400th anniversary.


The Unión Latina is sponsoring a symposium, "Celebrating Cultural Connections — History and Migrations."
